


Top-level Domains Blocking

If you want to block any top-level domain, just add it without a leading dot to your **Denylist**.

For example, if you want to block access to all websites in the RU domain zone, add **ru** to your Denylist.

(Chinese IDN ccTLD), **рф** (Russian IDN ccTLD), etc.
